



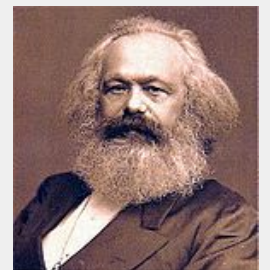

Evaluations will be kept strictly confidential and will not be read by faculty members until after grades are submitted.
