5) An effective classroom depends on students being respected as individuals in a manner free of bias or discrimination. In this class, do you feel that students were treated with respect and without bias?

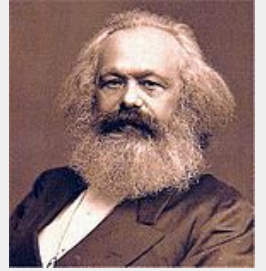
